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Thank you for your email of 8 September 2017 in which you ask for how many years land should lie fallow before organic farming can begin.

Council Regulation (EC) No 834/2007¹ lays out the rules on organic production and labelling of organic products. This regulation should be read in conjunction with Commission Regulation (EC) No 889/2008² which lays down detailed rules for its implementation, including production and processing rules.

Conversion periods are different depending on the type of crop or animal production of the farm. Article 36(1) of Regulation (EC) No 889/2008 sets out the conversion periods during which the organic plant production rules should apply before the products may be considered as organic:

- For plants and plant products, a period of at least two years before sowing;
- For grassland or perennial forage, at least two years before its use as feed from organic farming;
- For perennial crops other than forage, at least three years before the first harvest of organic products.
