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Thank you for your e-mail in which you request whether an operator using indoor aquaponic systems could be certified as organic under the EU organic legislative framework.

As you correctly mention, organic plant production is land-related in accordance with Article 4 (a) of Council Regulation $N^{\circ} 834/2007^{1}$.


Aquaponics is a type of hydroponics which according to Article 4 of Commission Regulation N° 889/2008 2 is a cultivation system not allowed in the production of organic plants. Thus, plants produced through hydroponics cannot be certified as organic under the EU Regulations on organic production.

On the other hand, the use of aquaponic systems for producing **aquaculture animals** is not prohibited. Therefore the production of fish in your facilities could be considered as organic only when done in compliance with the production rules set up in Article 15 of Council Regulation N° 834/2007 and Article 25a to 25t of Commission Regulation N° 889/2008.

In order to be able to certify your products as organic you should approach a control body in your Member State; accredited control bodies can be looked up on http://ec.europa.eu/agriculture/organic/consumer-trust/certification-and-confidence/controls-and-inspections/control-system_en.
