Importers of organic products must register with a control body or control authority

All consignments of organic products imported from countries outside the EU, excluding the European Economic Area and/or Switzerland, must be accompanied by a certificate of inspection. This certificate can be issued by:

- a control body recognised by the EU
- the control authorities or control bodies authorised by a country recognised by the EU.

The original certificate of inspection must be presented together with the imported organic products to the relevant Member State's authority. Usually it will be the local authority at the
